DIRECTOR'S HONOR

MISSION STATEMENT:

1. This individual's life and ministry should reflect a faithful example of the five core values of CIU. These are: Authority of Scripture, Victorious Christian Living, World Evangelization, Prayer and Faith, Evangelical Unity.
2. This honor is bestowed by the Director of Alumni Ministries at his/her discretion. There is no regularity specified for this award, in order to allow the Director to award this honor as often as he/she finds the appropriate recipient.
3. This award is made by the Director to honor those who have given support that encouraged and enhanced the effective ministry of the Alumni staff towards all CIU alumni. This award is not limited to, but may include, CIU alumni. This may include substantial volunteer help with Homecoming, Alumni Gatherings, Alumni Project, Alumni-Student Prayer Partnership, or other undertakings that impact CIU alumni.

PRACTICAL ASPECTS:

1. While this award is discretionary, it is important for the Director to consult with and advise the President of the AALC and/or the Executive Committee. This is not necessarily for approval, but is in order to protect the integrity of the award.
2. To further enhance integrity and to keep a faithful and lasting record, a file should be kept in the Alumni Ministries office which details each recipient of this award, and the reasons why the recipient was chosen for honor.
3. This honor can be bestowed during an AALC regular scheduled meeting, or by mail, or in person, at the Director's discretion and based on the recipient's convenience.
4. This honor could be highlighted with a short mention in the Upward magazine or other publication of the CIU Alumni Association. Further, a plaque which includes all the recipients, with brief mention of reason for the award and the date, could be displayed in the Alumni Center as a lasting remembrance.
